WELCOME TO CAMP ONLINE!

This year has been challenging for the summer camp industry. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, no camp looked the same as it had in prior years. This year, only 7% of camps nationwide hosted online programs, and thanks to you, Roundup River Ranch was able to host impactful, engaging, and intentional online programs for kids with serious illnesses and their families to experience the magic of camp...anywhere!

In 2020, our Camp Online programs varied in length from week-long Summer Camps, weekend Family Camps and Kids Camps, Saturday Day Camps, Camper Reunions filled with trivia, dancing, and games for the whole family, to Café au Lait, a special program created just for parents and caregivers. Additionally, Joy, Delivered, an out-of-the box camp experience that inspires hours of fun and creativity, was sent directly to campers' doorsteps, and we also developed a camper eNewsletter, Best Week Ever, so campers had even more ways to stay connected to camp.

Campers participated in camp from their bedrooms, patios, hospital rooms, and even tents set up in their living rooms. One of the highlights of camp this year was seeing campers engage with us month over month through multiple touchpoints. Campers and their families learned and grew together through a continuum of programs offered. These programs provided connection, special camp activities, new friends, and space to just be silly. Providing a consistent connection to camp during a time of isolation was imperative to our campers' health and well-being. For many families, camp was the only social outlet they had during stay-at-home orders. Together, we have helped build resilience in our campers and their families, so they can continue to thrive in 2021 and beyond. Thank you.





In 2020, Roundup River Ranch served campers from a total of 18 states during the camp season.



MEET ZACH. Wood Cookie Collector!

"It's an easy place to get away from all your troubles. Whenever I'm at camp or online camp, I forget about any bad troubles - because it's fun here. It's my happy place."

Meet Zach, a 13-year old returning camper from Parker, Colorado. He has participated at Roundup River Ranch for the past four years. He attended his first week of Summer Camp when he was nine years old.

Zach's family first heard about Roundup River Ranch through his kidney doctor. Zach is living with IgA nephropathy, a kidney disease that causes damage to the tiny filters inside his kidneys. There is no cure, but treatments can help prevent more damage to the kidneys.

When Zach found out camp was actually going to happen online this year – he was very excited. "Even if we're not physically at camp, the online version was pretty close to it. It felt like the same camp in many ways. I liked it a lot, and I was really happy."

The excitement for Camp Online really kicked in for Zach when his Camp Kit arrived at his door. When he opened the box, he was thrilled to see the familiar wood cookie nametag inside. It was just like starting his first day at camp! Zach proudly displays his collection of wood cookies in his bedroom. It's his way of remembering each unique Roundup River Ranch experience, and he likes to decorate them differently.

"I have about 20 wood cookies! I like saving them, because they remind me of all the fun times I've had at Summer Camp, Camper Reunions, and Ambassador events. When I look at them, it also makes me look forward to my next camp experience."

When not attending one of Roundup River Ranch's camp programs, you can find Zach swimming, building Legos, or just hanging out with his family (Zach is the oldest of three siblings).

One thing Zach really missed from Summer Camp on-site was the No-Hands Spaghetti Dinner, and slurping noodles with his camp friends. That will be something he looks forward to when camp on-site resumes. Roundup River Ranch listened to campers like Zach and many others to create new activities online. That's when our virtual No-Hands Spaghetti Dinner Camper Reunions were created. To provide a fun space for families to slurp, dance, and giggle together online.

This summer, Zach was very grateful to have had the safe space to connect and share his feelings online with camp friends. "Candle Chat was nice and fun to experience it at home. I really enjoyed it. It was easier for me to open up because it was virtual. You don't have to see people watching you, and not everybody has to look at you. I get shy when it comes to speaking in a room full of people, so it was a nice change. I opened up a little more to my friends."

The spirit of camp is something that will always stay with Zach forever, and he hopes that more kids like him get a chance to visit Roundup River Ranch.

"I wish every little kid with a disorder or disability could come and see camp, because it's really fun and I know they would love it."

An amazing out-of-the-box camp experience.



In addition to Camp Online, we also launched Joy, Delivered, an out-of-the-box camp experience that supports and engages children in fun activities that inspire creativity, compassion, resilience, teamwork, and play.

This new program allows us to meet our campers wherever they are, remind them of the fun of camp, provide support to families seeking respite, and encourage campers to try new things. Each box includes at least eight DIY activities including art projects, STEM activities, Get Up & Get Active movement cards, fun jokes, riddles, a songbook, solar activities, as well as other games and camp activities that can be experienced alone or with their family. Campers were thrilled to have also received a Roundup River Ranch camp t-shirt, provided by our official camp apparel sponsor, Abercrombie & Fitch this past year.

Being online, our campers were able to practice and perfect their skills before submitting videos or performing live.

Campers told jokes, sang songs, played instruments, hula-hooped, and much more. Together, campers discovered confidence and we celebrated shining moments.

One of our campers, Ella, shared, "Online Stage Night might have been even better than in-person Stage Night! I was able to film myself, so there was no stage fright, and then while I was performing I got to read all the encouraging things people were saying in the chat."



MEET THE PRESS FAMILY.

A returning camper family!

At just six years old, Caleb was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes, a disease that affects how the body uses glucose, the main type of sugar in the blood.

According to Caleb's mom, Leah, the biggest challenge they face day-to-day as a family, is trying to maintain Caleb's correct range of blood glucose, while not letting it become too intrusive to his life.



Because of his diagnosis, Caleb is limited in what camps and typical youth programs he is able to participate in. "Any other sleepaway camps that are developed to accommodate Type 1 Diabetics are just not within our budget – they are too expensive for us to be able to send Caleb," shared camper mom, Leah.

This year was the Press family's third year participating in Roundup River Ranch programming. When presented with the opportunity to sign up for camp online, they jumped at the chance "We decided to attend camp online because of our amazing experiences with traditional camp. Every year we have a blast, the staff is always awesome, and we knew the same level of care and compassion would follow to an online platform."

For the Press family, camp is much more than just the fun activities and camp programs (though they love those too). Their favorite part about Roundup River Ranch is all of the families they get to meet along the way. "The families at camp understand what it is like living with a serious illness. At home, none of our friends face the same challenges."

Camper dad, Craig, shared that one of the best parts of camp is that their family can completely forget about their child's illness. "At camp it is normalized in a way that everyone who is dealing with a lifelong diagnosis can breathe, and feel part of a larger community with similar challenges."

As a family, the Presses appreciated the opportunity to connect to camp virtually this year, at a time when the world seems so isolated. Caleb's favorite activity was the heart-racing, Minute To Win It challenges – an activity where our campers participate in timed challenges utilizing material received in their Camp Kit. As for the parents, they learned to not take themselves too seriously, and that it is okay to dance with strangers on a computer screen!

"Roundup River Ranch is a community that allows kids to be kids, and families to enjoy each other's company without all the 'other stuff.' We can let loose, have fun, and truly forget our worries. Camp is desperately needed for families going through these struggles, because serious illnesses are a daily and lifelong journey. Everyone needs an escape from the stressors of life. It is no different for families living with serious illnesses. Thank you for giving this to our family!"
