

# Know Before You Apply! 2023 Infectious Disease Protocol

# CAPACITY

- Capacity will range by cabin and session to support camper needs.
- •8-12 campers per cabin during summer camp.
- •2-3 families per cabin during family camp.

# VACCINES

- •All participants are required to complete the primary COVID vaccination series by May 10.
  Camp highly recommends boosters per CDC quidelines.
- See application for additional vaccination requirements.

# PRE-CAMP

 All participants will complete a formal arrival day symptom screening.

# **TESTING**

- Arrival testing may occur, dependent on current community spread.
- Exposure or symptomatic testing will be completed as needed.

Testing provided by Camp free of charge.

# MASKING

 Optional masking will be left to individual camper, volunteer, and staff choice.

#### COHORTING

- No restrictions.
- Reactive pods (quarantine), will be created if infectious disease exposure occurs.

### **ADDITIONAL POLICY UPDATES FROM 2022**

- We are pleased to accept applications for participants who use CPAP/BiPAP or have dietary restrictions.
- There are no travel restrictions for campers and volunteers.
  - o We recommend talking with your personal physician to decide if masking is right for you during travel.
  - $\circ$  The bus capacity will be increased from 10 to the bus maximum available.
- Volunteer vaccination policies:
  - Session volunteers are required to complete medical requirements, including submitting vaccination records. This includes volunteers working in cabins, medical, food services, and housekeeping.
  - Service project volunteers are not required to turn in proof of vaccination.
- Tour guests are welcome to see camp and are invited to join us for lunch. All guests will sit at a guest table.
