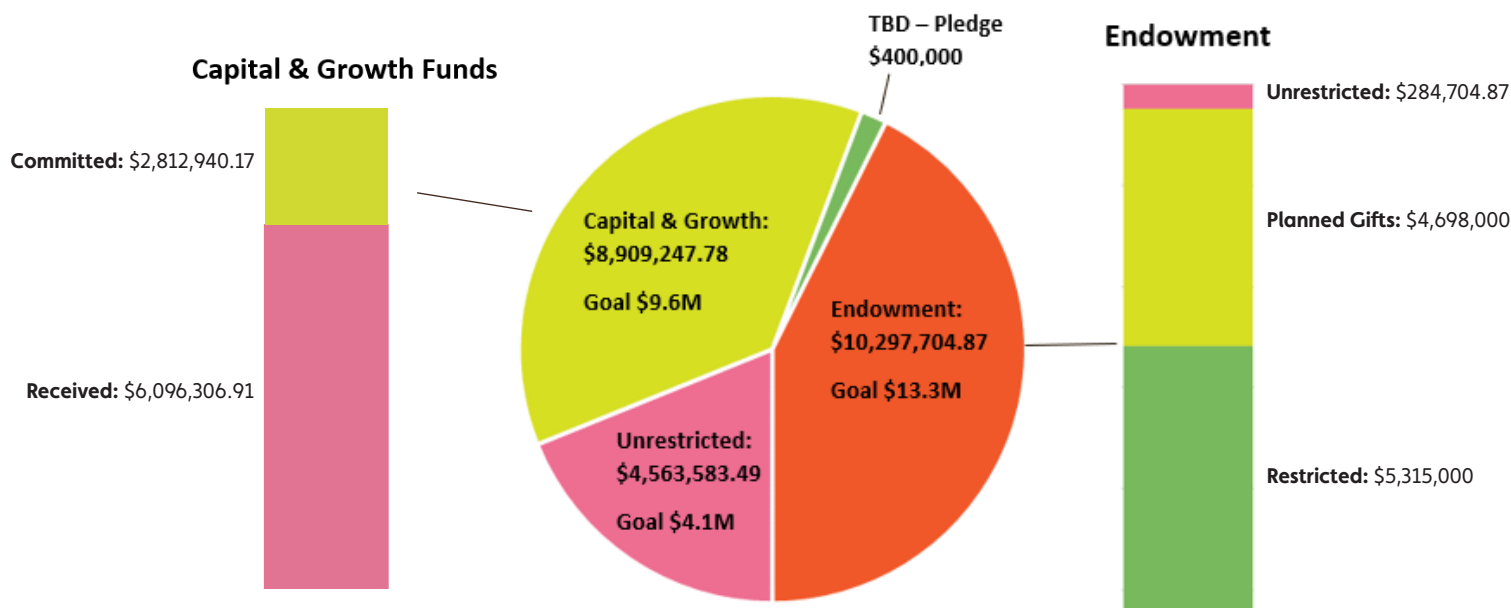

CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE



Our capital projects plan is strategically designed to support more transformative camp experiences by responsibly growing Roundup River Ranch in a way that will broaden our reach and increase our capacity to serve not only more campers, but a more diverse number of illnesses. The Roundup the Possibilities Campaign will provide funds to support this plan through the design and construction of:

- Three new cabins to increase the number of campers we serve;
- The initial planning and design work for a state of the art, multi-use pavilion to protect campers from the summer sun and the ever-changing Colorado weather while enjoying new outdoor activities;
- Essential infrastructure expansion, such as water and wastewater

treatment, necessary to support the increased numbers attending camp;

- Renovation and upgrades to Trent's Cookhouse and The Depot to boost the already robust safety and accessibility of the campus.

An updated Case for Support is enclosed noting a few differences from the original to reflect capital projects that have been completed and/or revised based on building costs, and the progress of the Campaign to date.

Rise to the Finish: Our Final Campaign Push

As we approach the culmination of our campaign, together we stand poised to reach new heights, leaving a legacy of hope, progress and possibility. Roundup the Possibilities began with a vision to create positive change and achieve a sustainable future for Roundup River Ranch. We have made substantial progress and realize that by rising to the finish, these shared achievements provide the promise of a bright future for camp and campers for generations to come. This phase of the campaign is about inclusivity, ensuring everyone regardless of their financial capacity can be a part of the Campaign and mission.
