A FAMILY DANCING TOGETHER IS HEALING TOGETHER



At Roundup River Ranch, there's no age limit on silliness, laughter, or needing a break from the real world. That's why Family Camp is a key tenet in our programmatic offerings. Thanks to your generosity, families are supported with love and empathy as they relish the unique opportunity to escape the stress of their child's medical condition and connect with others who are on a similar journey. We love knowing that a family dancing together is a family that is also healing together.

We'd like to introduce you to one of our amazing families, the Troop Family, who has attended Roundup River Ranch's Family Camp for children with life-threatening dermatologic disorders for the past two years. Four of their six children in the Troop family cope with "E.B." or Epidermolysis Bullosa, a serious disorder that causes the skin and mucosal membranes to become fragile and easily injured. There are many things they can't do and spend most of the summer inside. Son Zack's care alone takes about three hours a day.

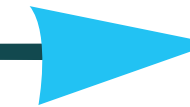
Troop Family Mom Kadee said, "It's hard to watch four kids be sick and struggle with their health and fight to find normalcy. It's hard as a parent to watch that. My healthy kids sacrifice a lot for their brothers and sisters. And that's what I LOVE about Roundup River Ranch – It accommodates ALL of my kids – not just my special needs kids, not just my healthy kids, but all of them. It's an amazing life to live with these kids. Their strength and how willing they are to take what they've been given and make the best of it."

Kadee also appreciates the opportunity to connect with other parents whose children have similar diagnoses. She said, "...it's always amazing to me to look in the eye of another parent at camp and see that they understand me. It makes for some really special moments. It's so special to be able to come to camp. It's something we wouldn't be able to afford on our own. It makes me feel like we live on a pretty amazing planet to have so many people who are willing to give so much."

What the experts at Yale University School of Medicine say about the life-changing impact of SeriousFun camp experiences.



Understanding the impact and positive changes the SeriousFun camps have on campers and their families is critical to ensuring we deliver the best possible experiences while the campers attend camp and that their newly developed skills last long beyond camp.

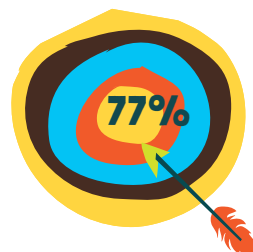
Through a multi-year collaboration with Yale Child Center Study, over 645 families from SeriousFun Camps around the globe completed pre- and post-camp surveys to reveal the impact of camp in the lives of children with serious illnesses. Researchers have determined that what is relevant at one camp is relevant across camps based on the best practices and rigorous criteria set across the Network. The results supported what we have known anecdotally for years – camp is more than just serious fun. The benefits of camp are lasting and real.

We are proud to share the key data findings from the 2014-2015 Outcomes Evaluation Study with you. These results will be used to inform and strengthen our camp programming. **Campers demonstrated significant positive changes, including increased confidence, self-esteem and social skills one month after camp.**

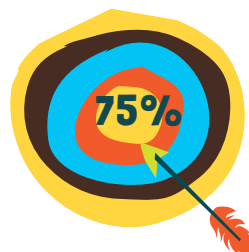
Changes in Children Noticed by their Families Following Camp:



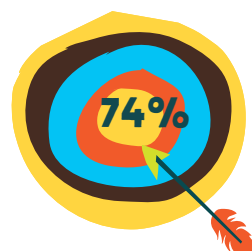

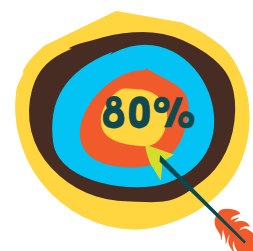

CAMP IS AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE HEALING PROCESS.

Impact on Camper Resilience:

Parents were asked to rate variables of social support related to resilience. **A key variable that improved one month after camp was Relationship Skills.** Improvement with these skills contributed to increases in many positive correlated outcomes including:

Attitude toward medical professionals



Attitude toward taking medication



Pro-social and passive coping skills



Comfort with making friends



Adaptability

The Child Study Center is a department at Yale University School of Medicine which brings together multiple disciplines to further the understanding of the problems of children and families. Among the many disciplines are child psychiatry, pediatrics, genetics, neurobiology, epidemiology, psychology, nursing, social work and social policy. The mission of the Center is to understand child development, social, behavioral, and emotional adjustment, and psychiatric disorders and to help children and families in need of care.

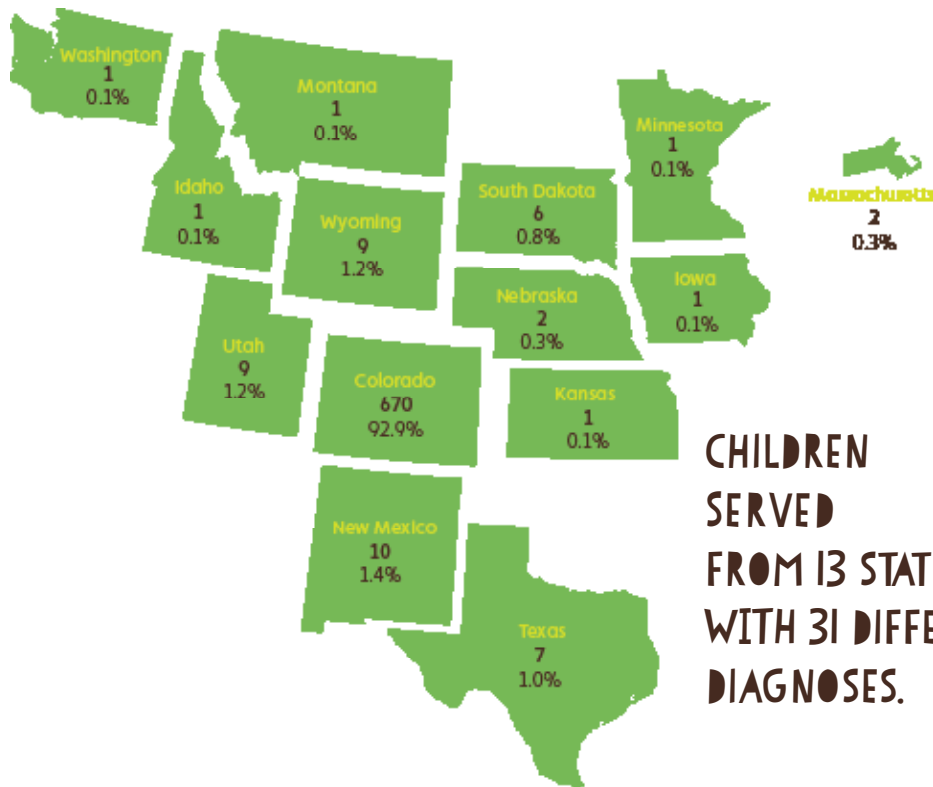

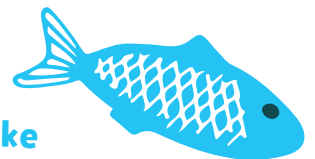

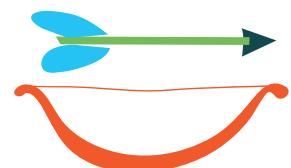

SUMMER CAMP

Freedom. Laughter. Fun. Success. Home. Learning New Things. Friendship. Best Week Ever. I Never Wanted to Leave. These are all phrases that Roundup River Ranch campers have used to describe Summer Camp. Roundup River Ranch's Summer Camp provides an experience that encourages children with serious illnesses to build self-confidence and discover the courage to try things they never thought they could do. It's an opportunity for children who are often defined by their illness or condition to enjoy a week of freedom and fun. Roundup River Ranch campers create a community with others who understand their medical journey; where stories are shared with those who have had similar experiences, forming a special community of friends that lasts beyond their time at camp. Each Summer Camp session serves approximately 68 children between the ages of seven and 17.

FAMILY CAMP

During Roundup River Ranch Family Camp session, it's not uncommon to see children cheering for their parents as they nervously climb to the top of the climbing wall or mom and dad donning silly costumes at Carnival Night; nor is it uncommon to see families connecting with each other, laughing, smiling, and remembering how much fun they have together as a family as they leave the worries of illness behind. Family Camp offers children ages 17 and younger with a serious illness and their immediate family members respite from illness and an opportunity to meet other families with similar experiences. Each Family Camp session serves approximately 18 families over a three-day weekend session.

CAMP FUN THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

Roundup River Ranch also offers a variety of off-site camp programs that continue the spirit of camp throughout the year. They include camper reunions, parties, and other camp programs. No matter the format of the event, one thing is certain – campers experience the extraordinary joy and fun of Roundup River Ranch wherever they are.



A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A CAMPER

7:30 a.m. Early Elk – Early rising campers kickoff the day with an optional camp activity. From yoga to fishing and other recreational activities, there's no better way to start the day.

8:15 a.m. Best Day Ever – Every day at Roundup River Ranch is the best day ever! A silly celebration of camp, a fun-filled weather report, and more kick off the Best Day Ever!

8:30 a.m. Breakfast – The most important meal of the day, often served with sides of bacon – one of our campers' favorite foods – and dancing.

9:15 a.m. Cabin Cleanup – Every morning the cleanest cabin wins the Dirt-Free Donkey award!

10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. ACTIVITIES!! – Campers rotate through two activity blocks and enjoy art, the challenge course, Odyssey of the Mind, fishing, nature, discovery, equestrian, and more!

12:30 p.m. Lunch – After a fun-filled morning of activities, it's time to groove for your food, refuel, and share stories. And then there's more dancing and repeat-after-me songs.

1:30 p.m. Feet Off Floor Time – Having fun at camp is hard work. Campers enjoy rest time in the middle day to recharge as they prepare for a busy afternoon of camp fun.

2:45 p.m. ACTIVITIES!! – Because activities in the morning aren't enough, there are even more activities offered in the afternoon. From rotating to the activity areas or participating in an all-camp activity like Silly Olympics, imagine lots of messy, silly, crazy, wacky, and paint-filled festivities.

5:00 p.m. Cabin Time – Some of the best time is spent in the cabin sharing stories from the day, playing games, dancing, and enjoying new friends before dinner and evening activities.

6:00 p.m. Dinner – Can you say No-Hands Spaghetti Dinner? Utensils are sometimes optional at dinner as entire meals are eaten without hands. And, of course, dinner is followed by dancing, dancing, and more dancing!

7:15 p.m. Evening Activity – From Cabin Night to the ever popular Stage Night, campfire, and more, evening activities provide yet another opportunity for more fun either as a cabin or an entire camp.

8:15 p.m. Candle Chat – Following a day of busy activities, it's time for reflection in a safe, respectful environment. Candle Chat provides a special opportunity to share and reflect, helping campers recognize their strength and the commonality they share with others.

10:00 p.m. Lights Out – Bed time! Lots of rest is needed to prepare for another fun and exciting day at camp.

Play Among the Stars

If you've ever been to Roundup River Ranch at night, you'll know what we're talking about...

There's something downright magical about looking at the stars in the sky at camp on a clear mountain night. We think that Roundup River Ranch might be one of the best places in the world to gaze at the stars. Our campers agree too – many campers recount their favorite camp memory as sitting in beanbag chairs surrounded by their friends gazing at the stars. When an elusive shooting star is spotted, the wishes and dreams of the campers are shared. One camper wished that her cancer would go into remission, another that he would find friends at school who understood him as much as he friends at camp did, and another that she would “never forget this moment, right here with each of you.”



Beginning this year, our campers will “Play Among the Stars” in our new astronomy program. Through the SeriousFun Innovation Grant program and the generous support of the Cora and John H. Davis Foundation, Roundup River Ranch will change the way campers can view celestial wonders at camp. We will renovate a telescope donated by Mary Ann Dodson, in honor of her late husband, Charles H. Dodson, build an observational dome, install the telescope, and create a special place for campers and families to explore astronomy at Roundup River Ranch year round. Additional improvements to purchase and install a computer video telescope and other enhancements have been planned as a part of this three-year improvement project to encourage campers to “Play Among the Stars”.

Boating across The Lake at Roundup River Ranch is a highlight for all campers.

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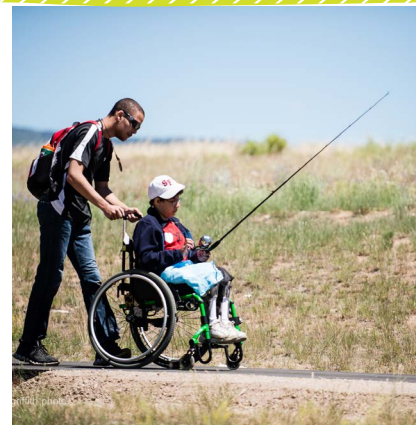
